The Combined Authority

The North East Combined Authority was formed on 7 May 2024, following a devolution deal for the North East being announced in December 2023.

Led by an Elected Mayor and Cabinet, covering the seven local authority areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside and Sunderland, the CA gives local people more control over the things that matter most to them.

Through devolution deals, the Government is giving areas of the country more powers to make their own decisions on issues such as transport, skills and support for business.

We work closely with organisations and people from all across the region.

Independent Business Case Appraisal

- The North East CA is undertaking a significant pipeline of investment. Such investment is required to be robustly appraised in accordance with the Single Assurance Framework and Treasury Green book amongst other guidance.
- Work emanating from the City Region Sustainable Transport Settlement, Bus Service Improvement Plan and the forthcoming Transport for City Regions programme is in scope through this tender.
- The types of projects where business appraisals are required (not exhaustive), are listed below.
 - Programme business cases
 - Rail Business Cases
 - Active Travel Business Cases (Programme Level and Assurance Statements)
 - Highways based interventions including modelling
 - Zero emission vehicle projects
 - Bus Capital and Revenue Projects
- As such projects are varied in their nature covering a whole host of transport schemes.
- A wider procurement for economic development projects is not included and may advance separately.





Introduction to the Invitation to Tender

- We have built this tender based on market and user engagement that took place in May and June 2025
- The procurement is for a ranked Open Procurement Framework (see overleaf) of a number of suppliers to undertake business case appraisal activities.
- The first task from the commission will be to refresh the business case guidance with clear templates and process maps and to ensure this process is collaborative.
- Consortium bids are permissible through this process. Up to six suppliers will be appointed
- In the operation of this framework regular engagement will take place with all appointed suppliers to build understanding, consistency and effectiveness in the operation of the contract. This should be reflected in submissions.
- Performance measures are also included as detailed overleaf.



Operation – Requirements

- Appointed supplier(s) will provide a final appraisal from the information provided in the business case and supporting documentation. This will include an unbiased evaluation of the business case, highlighting any risks or recommendations through a report and highlight tables.
- Appraisals will be high quality and clear which offer a clear and unambiguous view on the quality, deliverability and realism of proposals ensuring that applicant documentation is completed to a standard, inclusive and reflective of any queries, clarifications or development through the appraisal process
- A completed appraisal reports and highlight tables with analysis denoting red, amber, green matters with a suggested resolution. Where matters are not relevant, they should not be scored for example where the business case is advancing in phases.
- Typically, a draft appraisal report will be issued for resolution by the grant recipient (and if relevant their consultant teams) with optional meetings planned.
- The appointed supplier(s) will also be expected to work with North East CA, Transport and Programme Assurance Teams, North East CA Officers and the applicant / their suppliers to clarify any questions or concerns and ensure information is available to make high quality judgements.



Operation – Ranked Framework

- Framework suppliers will be ranked based on an assessment of quality and cost.
- Works orders will be placed from this framework call of contract using an order form and example will be shown in Appendix K. This will be a ranked framework using the following principles.
- Firstly, conflict management principles will apply, i.e. a consultant who has worked on the parent business case will not work on the appraisal regardless of a division of offices.
- The second principle is that the first ranked supplier will be given first preference followed by the second and third etc,
- Thirdly if a supplier has more than 4 task orders at any one time , the CA will determine that this should route to the next ranked supplier accounting for principles 1 and 2 above





- The framework is being procured as an Open Framework and is anticipated to start in October 2025 and will run until 31 March 2032. It is an Open Framework and as such the North East CA will review the contract in October 2027 and October 2029 to review contract performance, pricing and allow new entries to the market.
- The Provider shall be notified in writing not less than three months prior to the commencement of the review.
- This means that framework rates will be applicable from the start of the commission until the first review in October 2027 and October 2029.

- Appendix J: Tender response form .
- Any supplier who is successful in this Procurement will be required (before any contract is awarded) to enter into appropriate data protection agreements which are anticipated to be a Data Sharing Agreement (Appendix I).





Appendix J: Tender Response Form

- Each tender return is being evaluated and scored according the criteria as set out in Appendix F. This comprises of
 - Quality 80%
 - Price 20%
 - Terms and Conditions: pass/fail
- Guidance is available in each question with word limits stated, please adhere to the word limits
- Diagrams and tables can be used and do not form part of the word count but please do not add appendices with the exception of the provision of CVs of your delivery team in question 3.



Performance Measures

Timely Delivery	Suppliers return outputs within a timely fashion achieving a 95% compliance rate with the programme as agreed in the works order.
Outputs	At any stage during the contract suppliers should return queries of the Contracting Authorities and its partners within 5 working days .
	Efficacy of the advice will be tested by the Combined Authority to ensure it is accurate and robust with any recommended resolutions provided to the supplier, the supplier must return an action plan to embed those changes within 5 working days .

Payment will be associated with the delivery of outputs on a monthly basis as specified in the terms and conditions of the framework and the order form.



Social Value

- Social value is at the heart of the North East CA's commissioning and procurement activity it seeks to maximise the collective benefit of our investments for our communities and residents.
- Potential suppliers will be asked to outline the added social value their organisation currently
 provides, alongside the additional steps they will commit to taking if awarded this contract –
 e.g. becoming an accredited real living wage employer, creation of local jobs for local people,
 utilising local community organisations in delivery supply chains
- Potential suppliers are encouraged to sign up to the North East CA's good employer accreditation scheme. (Shine) <u>Shine homepage</u>
- If applying as the lead body of a partnership, potential suppliers will also be asked to set out their commitment to working effectively with partners during delivery.
- Social value commitments will be monitored as part of the ongoing contract and performance management process.

Procurement Process

- Assurance Procurement is timed go live on Friday 11th July 2025 via the Open e-tendering platform
- The initial term of a Contract for Service is anticipated to start in October 2025 and will run until October 2032 with reviews in 2027 and 2029 as referenced above.
- Once the ITT is live, all questions must be submitted via the e-tendering system no communication can be undertaken with the North East CA outside of this process

Urgent Action for all Suppliers to Register on our New Procurement Platform

As a supplier or potential supplier to North East CA you need to be registered on our new e-tendering system, Open.

Open will gradually replace the NEPO Portal and become the place to find and compete for tendering opportunities in the North East. It is **free to register and use**.

You will need to create an account on Open **to access and bid for public sector opportunities issued by the North East Combined Authority,** including this Connect to Work IPS Intervention.
